Even so, the rainfall levels for the past twelve months are 18 inches below normal for Volusia County and about the same for most of the St. John's River watershed as of the end of June. The shortage is nearly a third of the average rainfall locally. Landscapes utilizing native plants can reduce water use and help our burgeoning population cope with the water crisis that is in our future even with normal rainfall.

One example of this effort will be the first Pawpaw Chapter Fall Plant Sale (details elsewhere in this issue), bringing native nurseries to our area in an event to promote and sell native plants.
